Deneece Huftalin Named President of Salt Lake Community College



The Board of Regents has unanimously selected Dr. Deneece Huftalin as the eighth President of Salt Lake Community College. A 21-member Presidential Search Committee, chaired by Regent France Davis, narrowed the list down from an applicant pool of 55 to the three finalists announced last week after conducting an extensive nationwide search.

“With a large and diverse student population spread over multiple locations, the needs of this institution are complex and require a strong leader to be President,” said Dan Campbell, Chair of the Board of Regents. “I believe President Huftalin is that strong leader, and she will continue to positively shape SLCC, and the Salt Lake region as a result, for many years to come.”

Salt Lake Community College is one of eight institutions within the Utah System of Higher Education. SLCC is a student-focused, urban college that works to meet the diverse needs of the Salt Lake community. With a fall 2013 headcount of over 35,000 students, SLCC is Utah’s leading provider of workforce development programs and transfer students to Utah’s four-year institutions and a perennial Top 10 college nationally for total associate degrees awarded.

Regents Prioritize STEM Building Proposals in Support of State's Economic Priorities

Utah's STEM industries are growing, and the most job growth since the Great Recession has occurred in these fields. And STEM jobs are high-quality: STEM workers earn higher wages than other degree holders and experience the least unemployment. This year, to meet the current and future demand for a STEM-skilled workforce in Utah, the Utah Board of Regents has adopted a specific strategy to support the need for more STEM graduates by placing an emphasis on the prioritization of state-of-the-art, high-tech and dynamic STEM higher education facilities at USHE institutions. IS THE COST OF COLLEGE WORTH IT?

Much attention has been given recently to the total amount of student debt in America. And while the system isn't perfect and many issues remain to be worked out, the bottom line is **a college education is the best investment you can make for your future.**

The disparity in wages between college grads and those with only a high school diploma has never been greater. Students with a college degree earn on average \$20,050 more each year than high school graduates; that's an incredible 61 percent more annually. Over a lifetime, the worth of a college degree amounts to \$830,000 more earned than those with only a high school diploma.

It's not just wages that college grads have over those without a degree. Those with only a high school diploma are three times more likely to be unemployed and four times more likely to live in poverty.
