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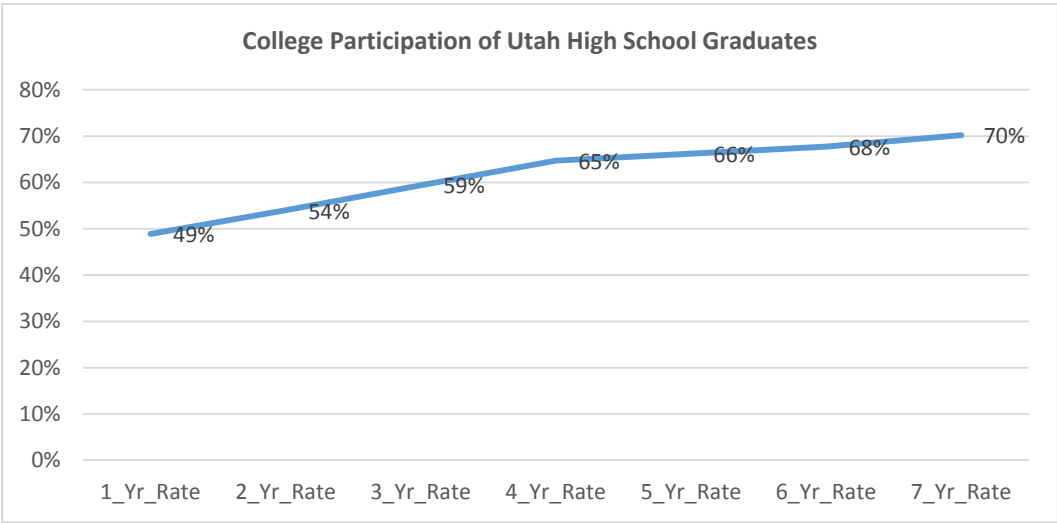
College Participation and Completion of Utah High School Graduates

Executive Summary

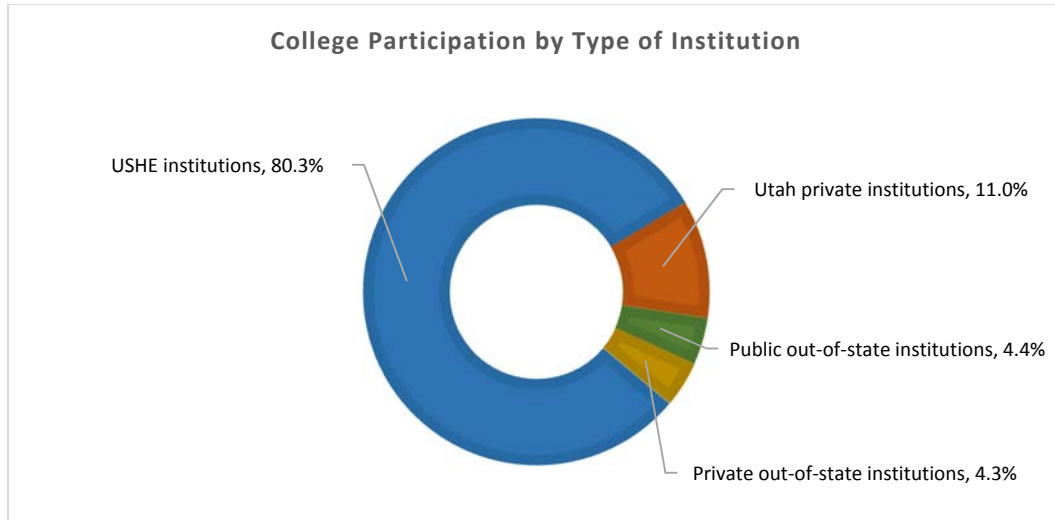
Relying on the most recent data provided by Utah State Office of Education (USOE), Utah System of Higher Education (USHE), and National Student Clearinghouse, this report examines the college participation rate of recent Utah high school graduates (cohorts 2007-2012) with a focus on the gap in college participation between Whites and minorities. The report also includes a brief examination of college completion rate of recent Utah high school graduates (cohorts 2007-2012) enrolled in college.

Key findings:

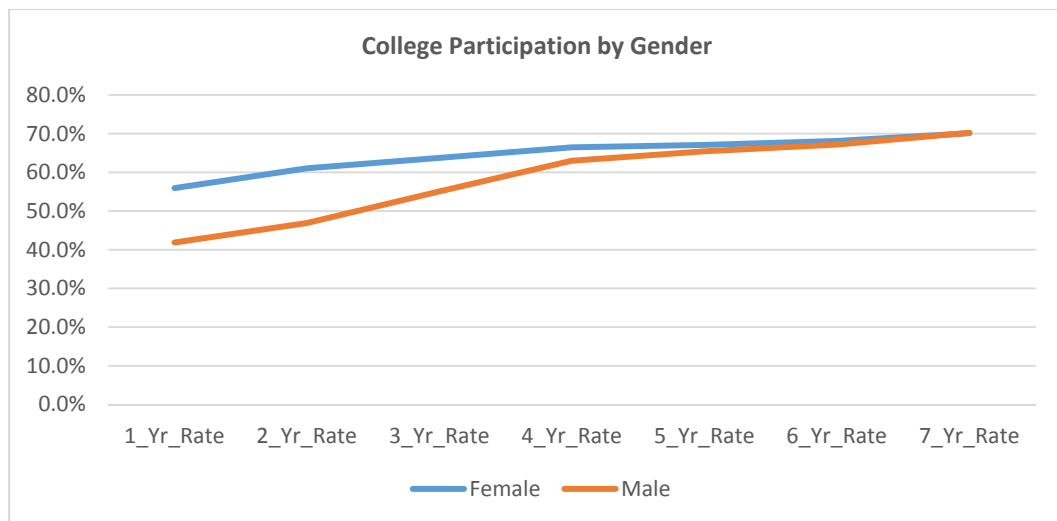
1. On average, 49 percent of Utah high school graduates (cohorts 2007-2012) attended a postsecondary institution in the first year after high school graduation. The college participation rate increases to 59 percent by the end of the third year, 66 percent by the end of the fifth year, and 70 percent by the end of the seventh year after high school graduation.



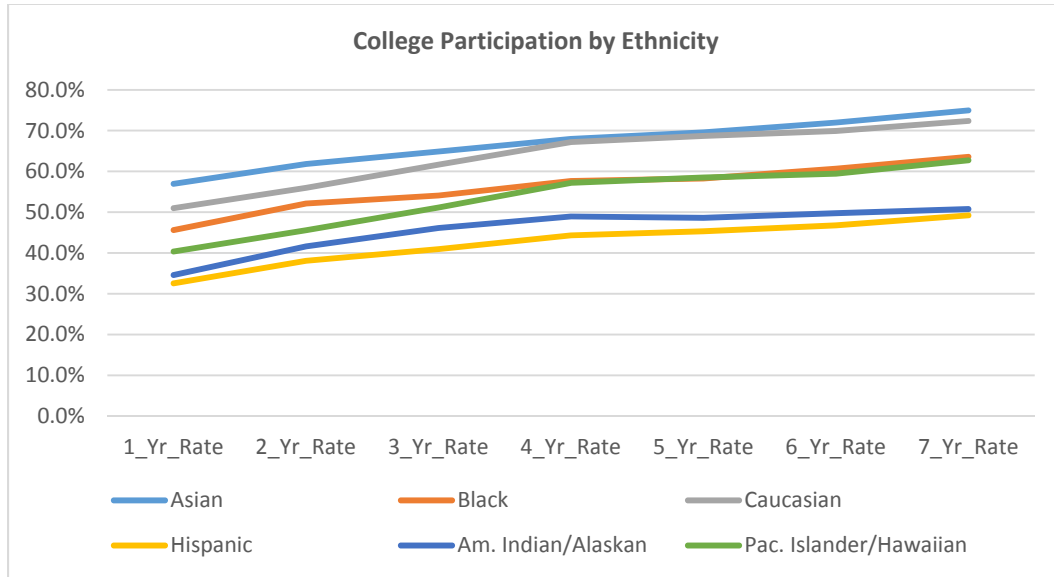
- On average, 80 percent of Utah high school graduates attended an USHE institution, 11 percent attended a Utah private institution, 4 percent attended a public out-of-state institution, and 4 percent attended a private out-of-state institution.



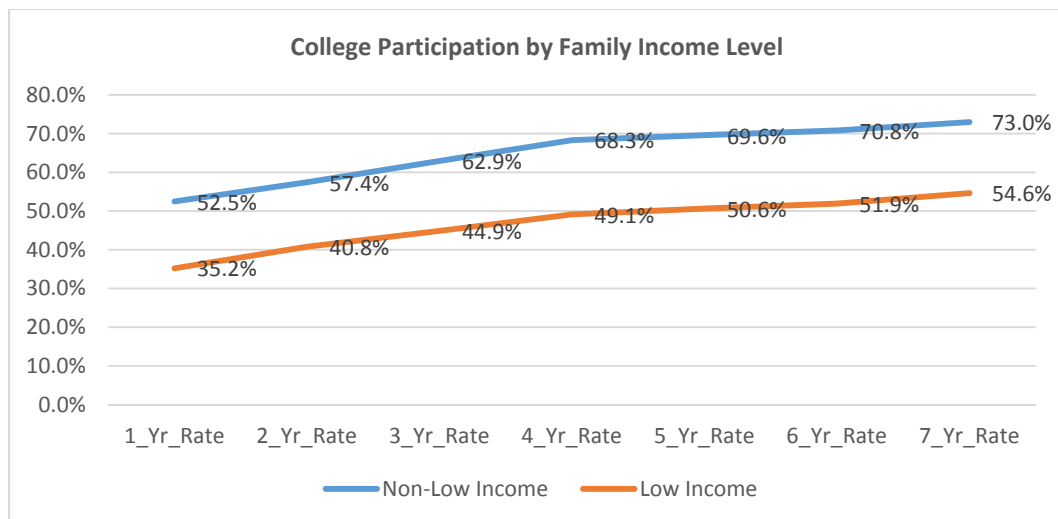
- On average, 56 percent of Utah female high school graduates attended a postsecondary institution in the first year after high school graduation, while 42 percent of male graduates did so. However, the gap in college participation rates between males and females gradually narrowed over time.



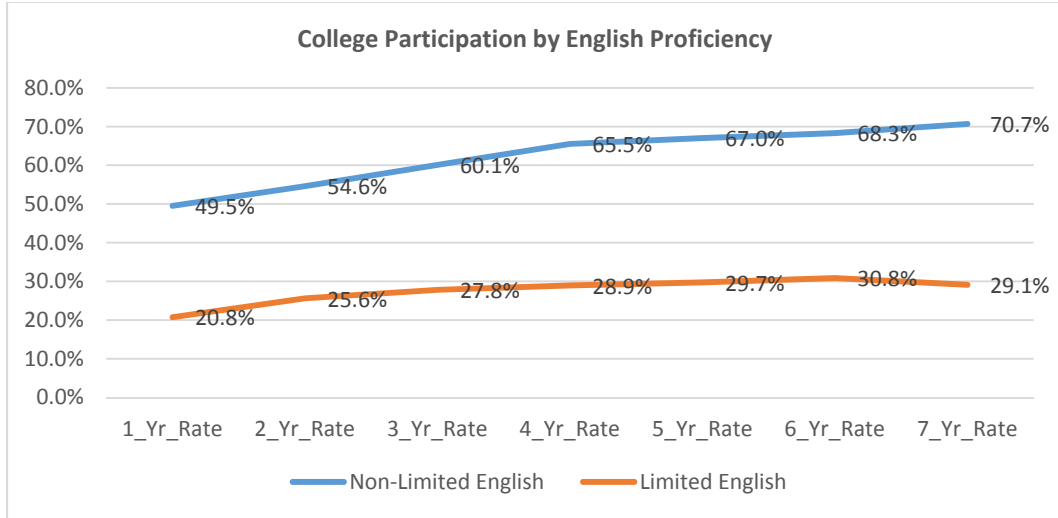
4. Comparisons between ethnic groups showed a gap in college participation based on ethnicity. On average, Asian and Caucasians had much higher college participation rates than all other minorities, with Hispanic graduates consistently lagging behind other minority groups.



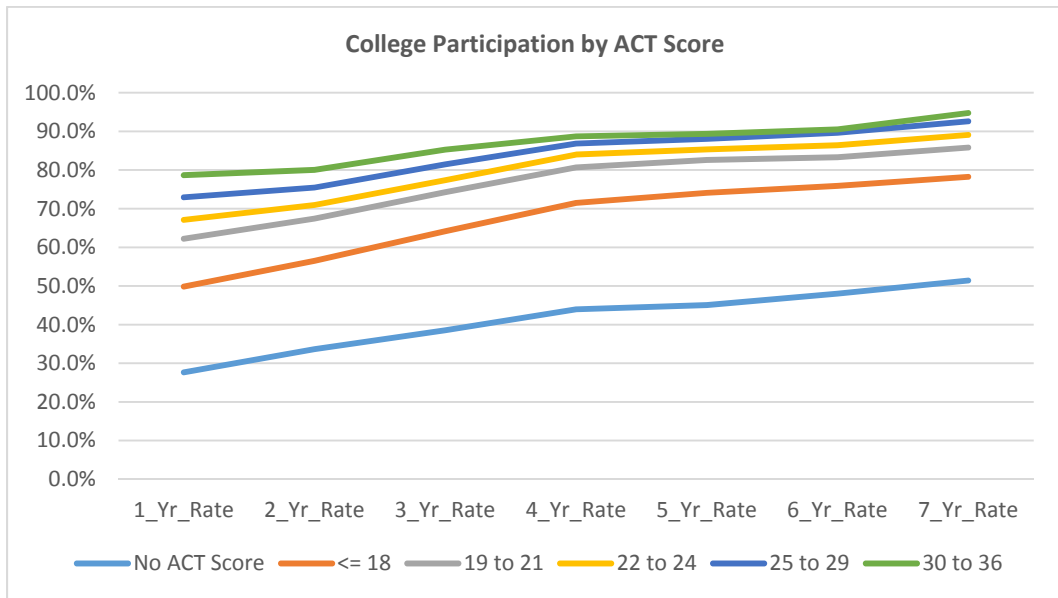
5. The family income level, measured by a student’s eligibility for free or reduced price lunch, was an important correlate to college participation rate. Specifically, the college participation rate for students from a low-income family was much lower than that for students not from a low-income family.



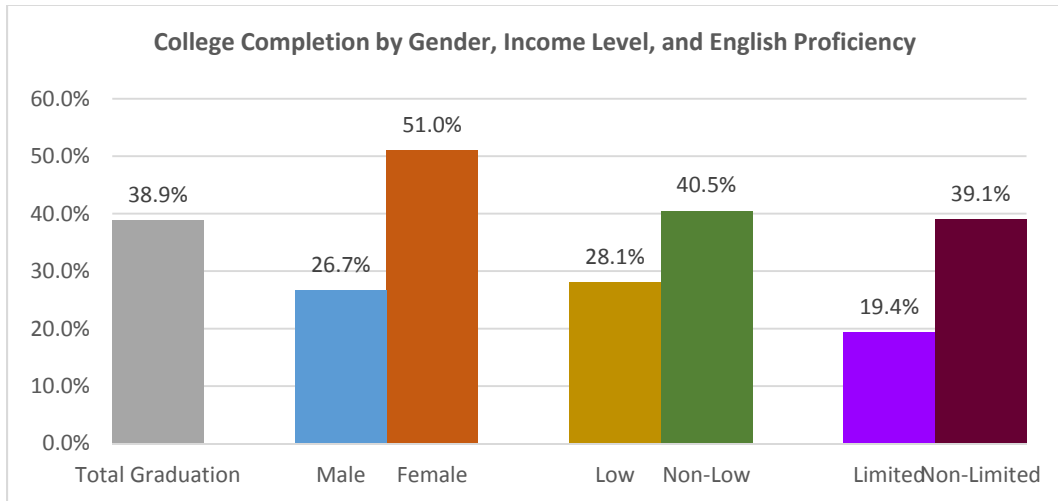
6. Graduating from high school with limited English proficiency was another factor that adversely affected college participation. In other words, Utah high school graduates who did not have limited English proficiency enrolled in college at a much higher rate than those who had limited English proficiency.



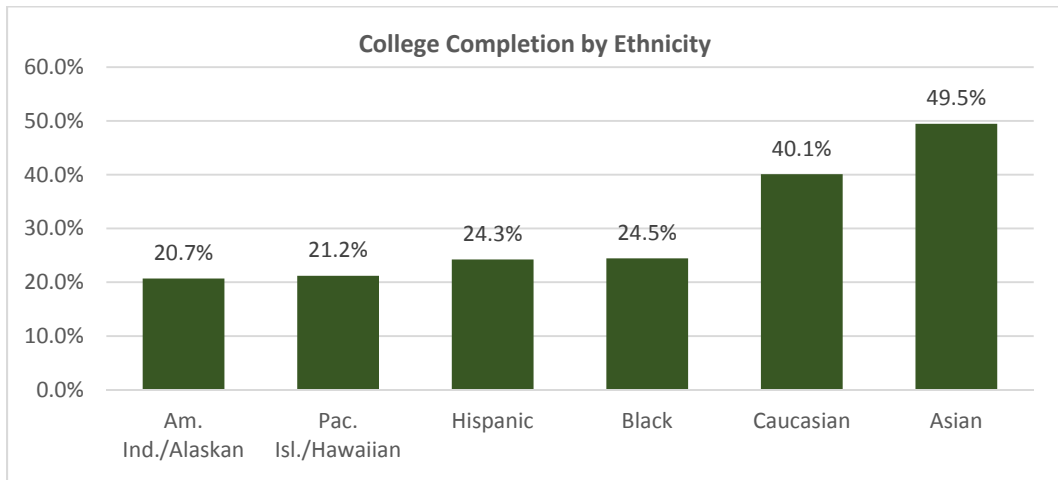
7. In Utah, not all high school graduates who entered college had ACT scores. However, college participation rates were favorable as long as students completed the ACT, even if their score fell below 18.



8. Among recent Utah high school graduates (cohorts 2007-2012) enrolled in college, 39 percent earned a postsecondary degree or certificate within six years after their initial entry into a postsecondary institution. Specifically, 51 percent of female students graduated from their institutions within six years, while the comparative rate for male students was 27 percent. Additionally, students not from a low-income family (41 percent) or not graduating from high school with limited English proficiency (39 percent) were more likely to graduate from college within six years than those from a low-income family (28 percent) or graduating from high school with limited English proficiency (19 percent), respectively.



9. However, the six-year graduation rates were not consistent across all races.



10. The average six-year graduation rates for recent Utah high school graduates enrolled in college also showed that students with high ACT exam scores were more likely to graduate from college.

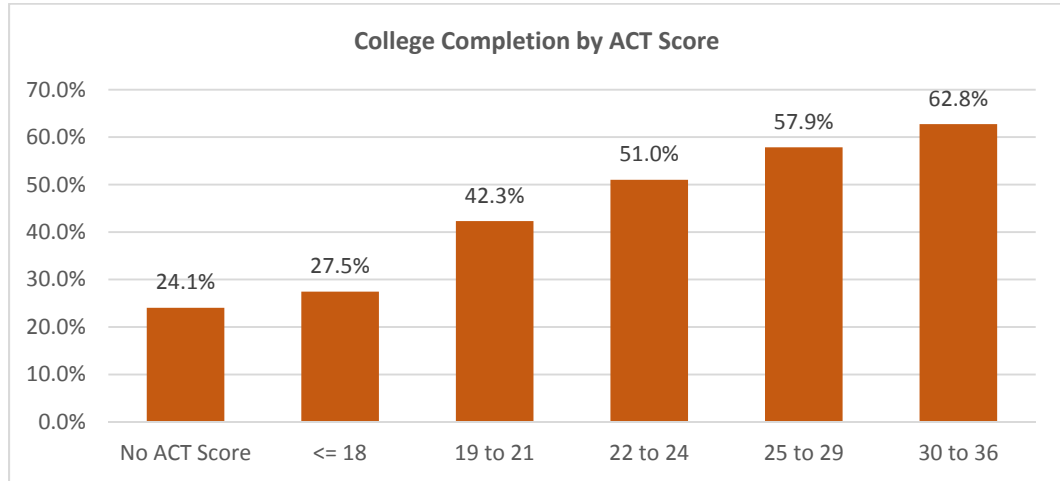
