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# CHANGING CAMPUS CULTURE

- Introduced October 2015 and was open to all public and private campuses in Ohio.
- Funded through the State Budget.
- Five Recommendations:
  - #1: Use Data to Guide Action
  - #2: Empower staff, faculty, campus law enforcement and students to prevent and respond to sexual violence through evidence-based training.
  - #3: Communicate a culture of shared respect and responsibility.
  - #4: Develop a comprehensive response protocol.
  - #5: Adopt a survivor-centered strategy.

## Changing Campus Culture

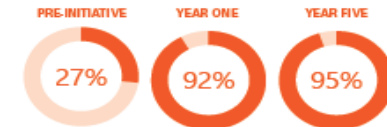
### The First Five Years

In October 2015, the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) introduced the Changing Campus Culture initiative. Through the Changing Campus Culture initiative, Ohio has taken a comprehensive, voluntary approach to ending sexual violence in our campus communities with support from the state budget.

Over the past five years, ODHE has asked campuses to report on their progress toward implementing the recommendations. This year, 76 campuses in Ohio (public and private) submitted information on their progress for the entire academic year, including the months disrupted by COVID-19. Data in the colored graphics reflect those campuses that reported their information.

#### Recommendation 1: Use Data to Guide Action

Ohio campuses that have collected comprehensive climate survey data



The move by campuses to a remote learning model in the spring of 2020 greatly impacted their ability to collect climate survey data. The percentages above include those campuses that had already collected climate survey data before the COVID-related shutdown and those that were enrolled in ODHE-provided vendor services set to launch in late March/early April.

#### Recommendation 2: Empower staff, faculty, campus law enforcement, and students to prevent and respond to sexual violence through evidence-based training.

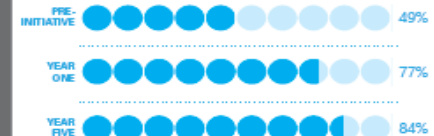


Campuses providing response training



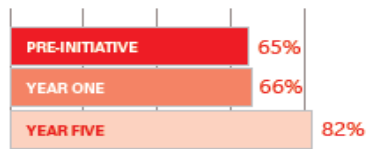
#### Recommendation 3: Communicate a culture of shared respect and responsibility

Campuses that have developed an awareness campaign



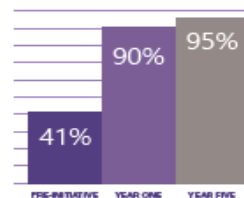
#### Recommendation 4: Develop a comprehensive response protocol
