Summary Description and Explanation:

A 2.0% tuition increase will allow WSU to better retain current faculty and staff. This modest increase in tuition includes funding for Faculty Promotion and Tenure. WSU will be able to cover our increasing fuel and power costs as well as needed upgrades to our HR software. WSU also needs an additional 2.71% tuition increase to cover the required shift of Student Fees to Tuition

WSU made significant efforts through reallocation, cost savings, and efficiency but that is not enough to allow us to continue our current improvement efforts. If we do not receive a tuition increase then we will experience a negative impact across the board. We will likely lose staff at an even higher rate and not be able to provide the services needed by our students. WSU will also not be able to meet the legislative required match.

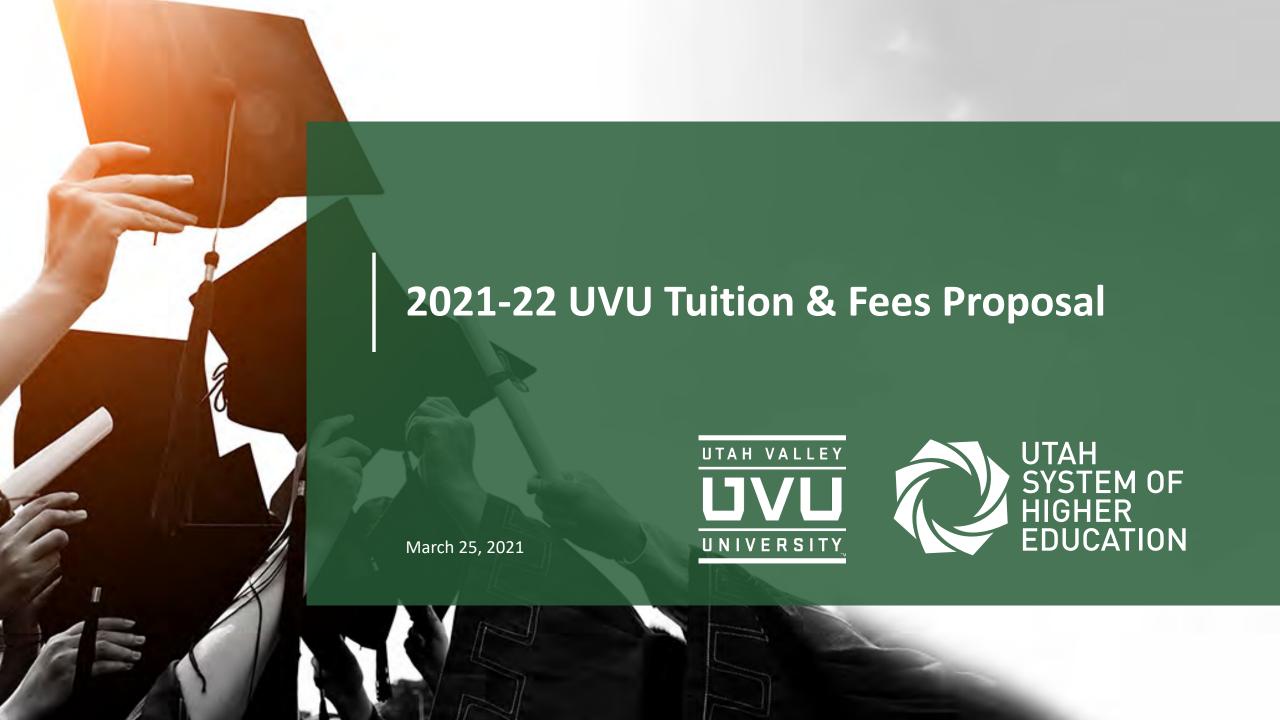

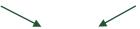
Focus on transitioning expenses to appropriated funds

- General administrative expenses (technology, IT support, marketing support, administrative staff)
- University services (student mental health, campus events)
- Core expenses not generally influenced by UVUSA (Athletics head coaches & 1st assistant coaches)

As recommended by UVU's General Student Fee Board and approved by UVUSA, President's Council and Board of Trustees, UVU proposes a general student fee decrease of \$74.94 and a tuition increase of \$88.00 (net change of \$13.06) for both resident and non-resident students.

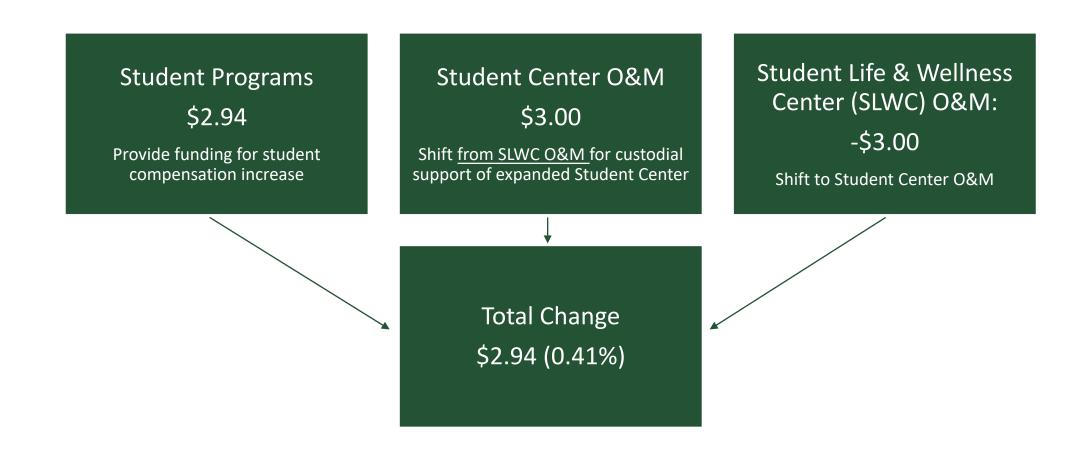
Student Fees Decrease of -\$74.94 (-10.5%)

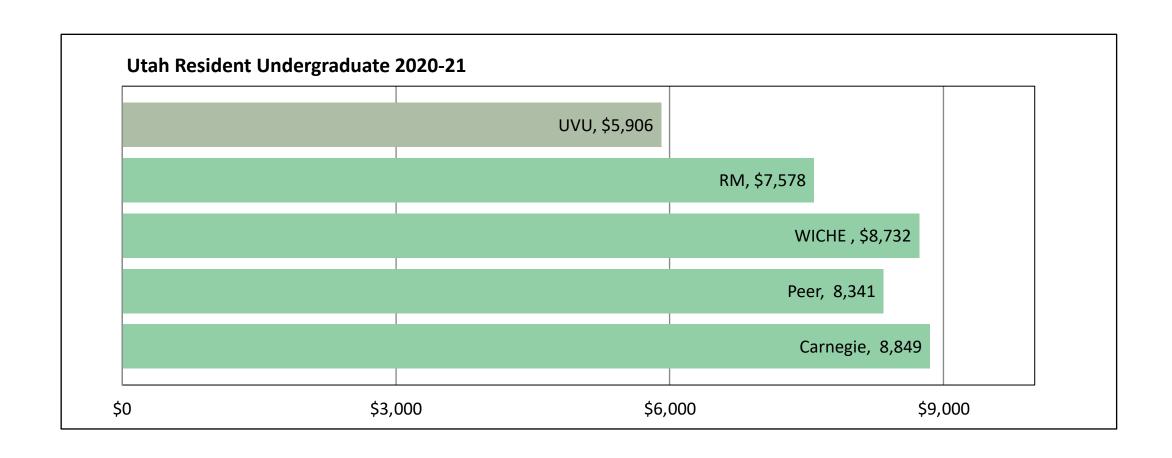

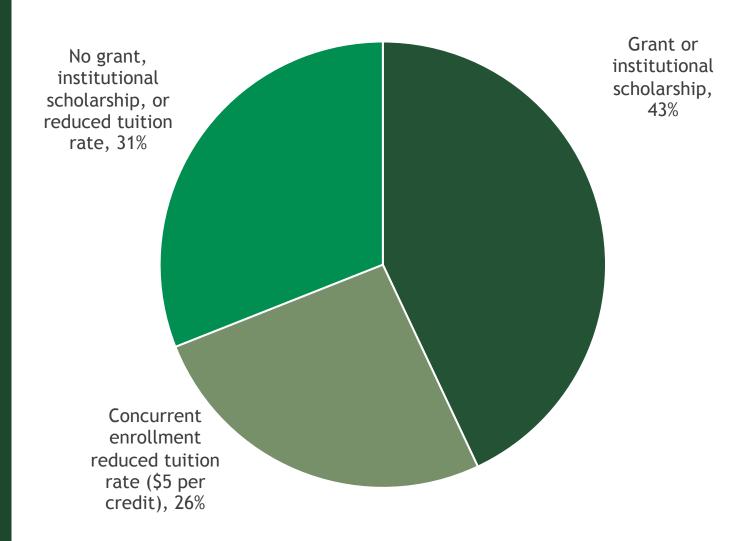


Affordable Education: Discounted Tuition vs Sticker Price

UVU's "sticker price" for tuition is not the actual price our students pay

- 43% of our students receive some form of financial aid that does not need to be repaid
- Concurrent Enrollment students pay a steeply discounted tuition of only \$5 per credit
- Based on this data, UVU's estimated discounted tuition rate is \$1,904 (meaning average out-of-pocket tuition paid by UVU students)

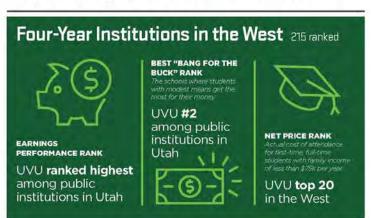
UVU Undergraduate Students Receiving Grant, Scholarship, or Reduced Tuition Rate, 2018-19

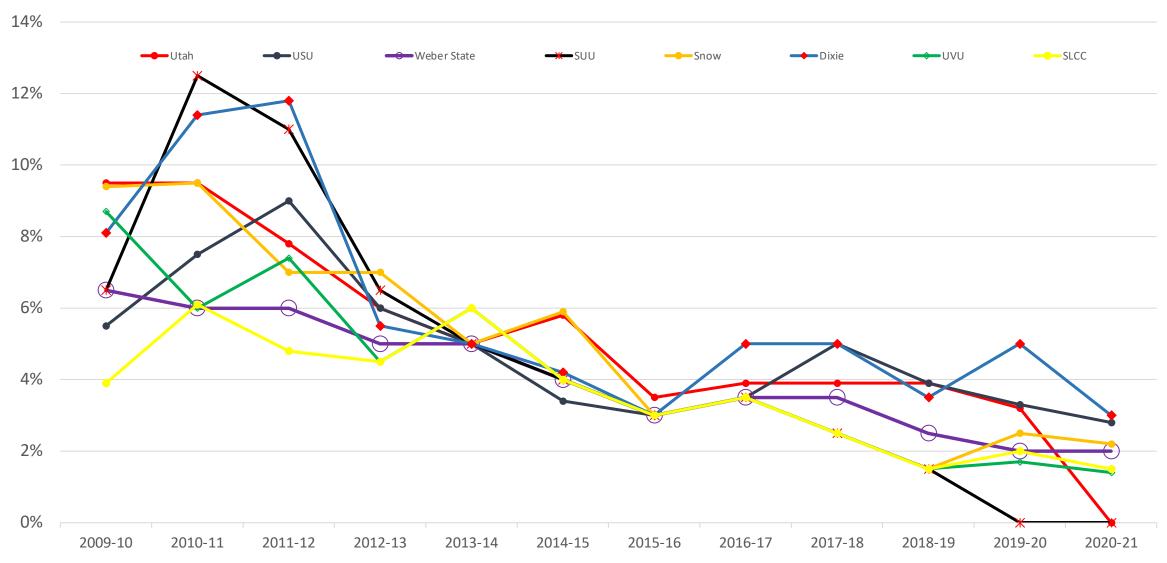

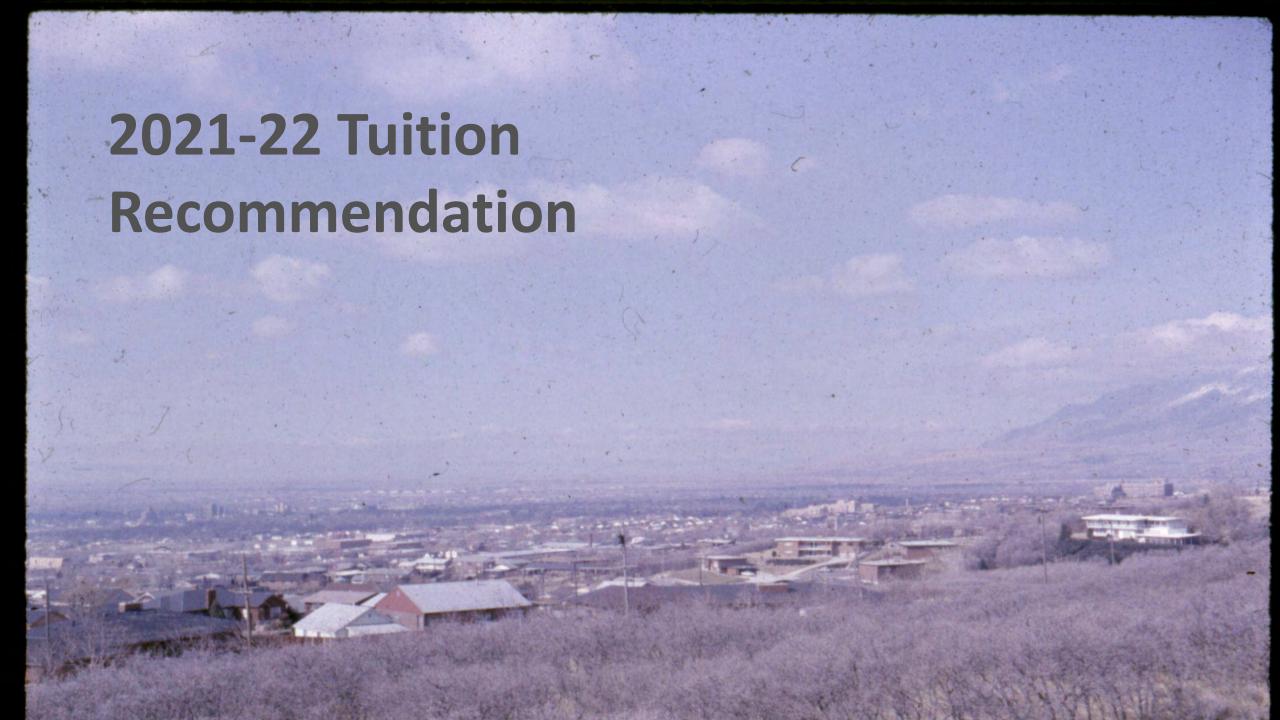

Detail of Institutional Tuition Requests

- Faculty Promotions Total Need \$495,000
 - Faculty Promotions are budgeted separately from general salary increases
 - They are driven by policy as faculty progress through the rank/tenure process
 - WSU was allowed to ask for this funding from the Legislature (unfunded)
 - \$304,158 will come from Reallocations/Performance Funding
 - It is requested that the remainder come from new tuition dollars (\$190,842)
 - This represents a 0.25% tuition increase



Detail of Institutional Tuition Requests

- Fuel and Power Rate Increases Total Need \$128,000
 - The Utah Legislature has consistently declined to fund F&P rate increases
 - During FY21 WSU will incur a 1.5% increase in its Power Rates

 - Functions include Hiring, Comp., Performance Evaluation, Benefits Admin.
 - \$84,000 is needed for this purpose
 - It is requested that these funds come from new tuition dollars
 - This represents a 0.10% tuition increase

GENERAL STUDENT FEES MOVING TO TUITION

- DSU began shifting student fees to Education & General (E&G) funding several years ago
 - FY16: Banner student fee (\$37.70 per year) eliminated and replaced with \$250,000 E&G funding (equivalent to 1% tuition increase at the time)
 - FY17: Student Services Programs student fee (\$111.80 per year) eliminated and replaced with \$720,000 E&G funding (equivalent to 2.77% tuition increase)
 - FY20: IT Support student fee reduced from \$52.00 to \$10.00 per year and replaced with \$289,800 E&G funding (equivalent to 0.97% tuition increase)

GENERAL STUDENT FEES MOVING TO TUITION

- Student Fee Advisory Board (SFAB) meetings held weekly in January and February 2021 to review all student fees
- SFAB voting membership comprised entirely of students (DSUSA Executive Council and students at large)
- SFAB recommendations presented to students on 2/25/21 and DSU Board of Trustees on 3/5/21
- Impacts of Student Fee Conversion to Tuition
 - Overall, a \$57.50 decrease in student fees will result in a \$58 increase in resident tuition and a \$185 increase in nonresident tuition (before tuition discounts)
 - Total 6.85% decrease in student fees resulting in a total 1.2% increase in tuition
- Recommendation to the Board



ADDITIONAL GENERAL STUDENT FEE CHANGES

- Increase DSUSA fee by \$10.00 and eliminate One Time Expense Fund fee (\$12.00)
 - Bring one-time expense planning under the direct oversight of DSUSA Executive Council
 - Net annual fee decrease of \$2.00
- Increase Department of Student Involvement fee by \$7.00
 - Expand part-time position to full-time for oversight of Spirit Squad and Student Involvement assessment
 - Department hasn't added personnel for seven years, despite more than 50% enrollment growth



ADDITIONAL GENERAL STUDENT FEE CHANGES

- Increase Health and Wellness fee by \$10.50
 - Add capacity for student mental health visits: full-time intern and part-time counselors
 - Demand for mental health services accelerated by COVID-19
- Convert half of Fine Arts fee (\$6.00) to tuition, transfer remaining Fine Arts fee to new Athletic Bands fee (\$6.00)
 - Desire for stronger pep band presence at DSU athletic events
 - Additional resources will be needed in the future to create a marching band
- Recommendation to the Board

DETAIL OF INSTITUTIONAL REQUESTS (R-4B FORMS)

Faculty Rank Advancements (0.57% tuition increase)

- Anticipated successful completion of rank advancement, intermediate review, or post-tenure review for 42 full-time faculty
- Rank advancement process is essential to recruiting and retaining qualified faculty
- Annual institutional funding commitment, normally funded from tuition increase
 - USHE requested legislative funding, but request was not funded
- \$200,000 needed for faculty salary increases



DETAIL OF INSTITUTIONAL REQUESTS (R-4B FORMS)

- Part-Time Faculty and Staff Wage Increases (1.30% tuition increase)
 - Approximately half of all DSU courses taught by part-time instructors
 - DSU currently pays less per credit to part-time faculty compared to USHE peers
 - Part-time staff at DSU generally paid 10%-20% less than similar private sector jobs
 - \$455,000 needed to supplement state compensation funding
 - Increase adjunct rate by \$50 per credit
 - Implement across-the-board rate increase (up to \$1.00 per hour) for hourly staff
 - Lower paid staff to receive larger increases



DETAIL OF INSTITUTIONAL REQUESTS (R-4B FORMS)

- Student Recruitment Outreach (0.50% tuition increase)
 - Recruiting, marketing, and new student orientation personnel/operations have been reliant on one-time funding
 - Outreach/orientation programs are critical to successful recruitment and retention efforts
 - Targeted orientation fees deter participation (tuition funding preferable)
 - \$175,000 needed for part-time orientation coordinators, food and printing expenses for first-year student events, and ongoing funding of a full-time photographer/videographer position

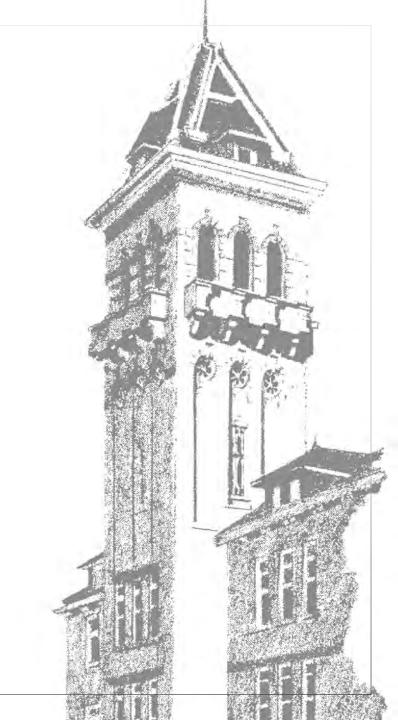

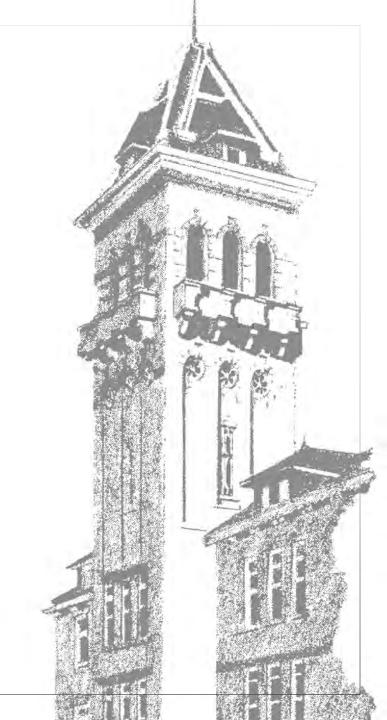
