- Spring Classes immediately changed to virtual delivery Tough!
- We noticed a huge loss of social interaction, a sense of loneliness, and increased rates of depression were being experienced by some of our students.

IN RESPONSE:

- We began using the **Student Pulse** program to connect regularly with students
- We worked to plan and promote creative ways to socialize and interact
- We were deliberate in providing an engaged college experience by holding weekly
 Wednes "D" Events (drive in & dive in movies, virtual events in all shapes and sizes,
 outdoor socially distanced concerts, outdoor service events,
 Bingo in the Burns, etc.)
- We continued supporting the BWC through an increased student fee.
- Advocated for the return of face-to-face instruction this semester!

THE DIXIE NAME

• The Executive Council met to examine, study, and better understand the Dixie name change issue.

 As the DSUSA Executive Council, we determined a name change would be in the best interest of our students, which is always what comes first.

 As the DSUSA Executive Council, elected by the student body, we voted unanimously to support a name change recommendation.

 Prior to the session we hosted a forum with local legislators to share our ideas and concerns... and to ask for their support in voting to allow a name change process to proceed.

 We shared with them our view, that a name change for the institution, although difficult, would be the best thing for our student body.




THE RALLY
