

The college admissions fee will be lowered by 50% to \$20. The college continues to provide robust financial aid, scholarship, and student employment opportunities which align with high-impact practices that yield student access and success.

How does this tuition increase advance higher education opportunities for underserved or underrepresented students and communities?

The tuition increase provides for market competitive salaries to retain employees which impacts student support functions and employee morale. Positive morale translates to helping students succeed.
