Regent Policy 312: Institutional Mission Roles

4.2. Regional Universities: The regional university's role is to provide open-access academic and career and technical education, undergraduate associate and baccalaureate programs and select graduate degree programs to fill regional or state workforce demands. Career and Technical Education programs are designed to meet workforce needs, lead to a certificate or degree, and include general education coursework. Articulation agreements allow students to transfer seamlessly from institutions offering Technical Education to CTE and academic pathways. Regional universities emphasize teaching, scholarly, and creative achievements that complement pedagogy, learning, and community service. The institution is a leading contributor to the quality of life and economic development at the local and state levels. Student success is supported through developmental programs and services associated with a comprehensive community college.

\$1.5 Million Legislative Appropriation

- Partnership to address critical workforce shortages
 - Physician Assistant Studies
 - Occupational Therapy
 - Physical Therapy
- Seed funding for program start up (Goal- Self Sustaining)
- U of U will incubate programs
- DSU will take over programs after full matriculation
- Funding will continue to be used to address critical workforce shortages



Physician Assistant Program

- Started Fall 2017
- Student Cohorts
 - 2018= 18
 - 2019 = 18
 - 2020 = 21
 - 2021 = 24
- Three graduating classes 2020, 2021, 2022
- Separation 2026



Physical Therapy Program

- MOU Signed March 2022
- First Class May 2022 (18)
- Designed Space Human Performance Center
 - Faculty agreement
- Separation 2030




Occupational Therapy Program

- U of U Decision: No bandwidth to offer satellite program (2019)
- Support DSU in Occupational Therapy start up
- October 2019 DSU submits ACOTE request
- December 15, 2022: DSU submits candidacy application
 - Hire Program Director (1 year prior)
 - Hire Clinical Coordinator (6 months prior)
 - Curriculum Approval
- April 2023: Candidacy Application Decision by ACOTE
- First Class Fall 2023
