DCAT



- Increase general tuition rates by **2.75%** for all undergraduate and graduate tuition tables, including resident and non-resident rates.
- Establish a differential tuition, flat-rate amount of **\$95** per credit hour for selected general education courses offered at Davis and Ogden-WeberTechnical Colleges.
- Set a differential tuition surcharge of \$154.36 per credit hour for the Master of Science in Systems Engineering and the Master of Science in Data Science programs in the College of Engineering, Applied Science, & Technology (EAST).
- Increase general fees by 1.75%.

Proposed Adjustments to Tuition

0.82% (\$44.86 per year) to fund:

- \$500k fuel/power increases
- \$206.3k cybersecurity software & support`

Institutional Request Uses

- Reallocating for 2024-25 needs:
 - \$500k in prior year performance funding
 - \$600k in enrollment growth tuition
 - \$200k from central facilities/benefits accounts
- Using to fund:
 - Faculty tenure/promotion
 - Student Success Playbook
 - New program commitments
- \$1.9m in strategic priorities unfunded
- Reallocated \$4.6m in 2022-23
- Tuition freeze scenario: Cut 8-12 positions

Exploring Other Resources



- Within available financial aid and rule of 10 calculation.
- WSU 10-year average tuition & fees increase (2.5%) is less than national (2.8%) or regional (3.3%) CPI.
- Favorable affordability in all USHE, regional, and national peer comparisons.
- Provided \$88.1 million to 12,241 students in 2022-23 (including 'CATapult & Dream Weber).
