- The modernization and expansion of university operations to fulfill its R1, public service, and landgrant mission; and

WHEREAS, President Cantwell reinforced Utah State University's mission as a statewide institution by expanding access to higher education, advancing workforce development programs, and strengthening USU's economic contributions to the state; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Cantwell holds a bachelor's degree in human behavior from the University of Chicago, a PhD in Mechanical Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley, and an MBA from the University of Pennsylvania, The Wharton School;
