\$4 decrease in Communications Fee

- Student newspaper and radio programs terminated
- Student Fee Advisory Board voted to reallocate to other existing fee categories where funding was not adequate
- Student Fee Advisory Board voted to maintain fees at \$204 (per semester)



- \$0.55 increase/reallocation (\$4.45 to \$5.00) to Theater Fee
 - Annual increase of \$2,757 (\$22,308 to \$25,065)
 - Fee has remained unchanged for 15 years despite inflation
 - Funds are used for set construction, costumes, lighting, sound, and other production elements
 - Fee allows students to attend live theatrical productions at significantly reduced ticket prices and the increase in fee will allow ticket prices not to increase at this time



- \$0.45 increase/reallocation (\$3.00 to \$3.45) to Fitness Center Fee
 - Annual increase of \$2,256 (\$15,039 to \$17,295)
 - Most equipment was purchased prior to 2020
 - Funds have not been adequate to keep up with maintenance and replacement costs of equipment in the fitness center
 - In 2024, the Fitness Center recorded 53,000 user visits showing the high demand by students
 - Fee allows students to visit the Fitness Center free of charge supporting their overall mental and physical well-being leading to improved academic success



- \$3.00 increase/reallocation (\$46.15 to \$49.15) to Student Events & Activities Fee
 - Annual increase of \$15,039 (\$231,354 to \$246,393)
 - Fee has remained unchanged since 2016 despite inflation and rising costs
 - Current allocation is not adequate to host weekly activities for the entire student body
 - Student demand for weekly events is not being met
 - Funds are used for venues, entertainment, supplies, and services for student activities
 - Fee provides student activities that 1) promote engagement and belonging, 2) are critical for a rural campus experience, mental health and well-being,
 3) provide leadership and school spirit, and 4) enhance academic success and retention

Detail of Institutional Requests (R-4B Forms)

- Advancement & Tenure, Degree Advancements \$76,000
 - Allows for consistent practice of development to attract and retain qualified faculty and staff
 - Faculty increases for FY '26 \$61,000
 - Staff increases for FY '26 \$15,000
 - No other ongoing revenue source available
 - Increase equates to ~\$10 per semester or a 0.6% increase
 - Student body was supportive of this increase
