

The U has the highest among Utah's public institutions.







6-year graduation rate per IPEDS Median Earnings per the College Scorecard 10 years after entry

David Eccles School of Business Executive MBA Tuition Proposal Graduate Tuition

Approximately a 6.9% increase for 2026-2027

A graduate student in the Executive MBA program will pay approximately \$1400 more per semester in 2026-2027

David Eccles School of Business Professional and Online MBA Tuition Proposal Graduate Tuition

Approximately a 6.5% increase for 2026-2027

A graduate student in the Professional or Online MBA taking 8 credit hours will pay approximately \$800 more per semester in 2026-2027

David Eccles School of Business Specialty Masters Programs & FT MBA Tuition Proposal Graduate Tuition

Effective for all SMP programs and full-time MBA

Approximately an 11.2% increase for 2025-2026, and an approximate 8% increase for 2026-2027

For 2025-2026 graduate students will have a cost of \$1,250 per credit hour For 2026-2027 the cost will increase to \$1,350 per credit hour

A graduate student in any of the Specialty Masters
Programs or FT MBA taking 10 credit hours will pay
approximately \$1,260 more per semester for 2025-2026, and
\$1,000 more per semester for 2026-2027



David Eccles School of Business Masters of Business Creation (MBC) Tuition Proposal Graduate Tuition

Approximately a 10% increase for 2025-2026, and an approximately 9.1% increase for 2026-2027

An increase of \$50 per credit hour for each of the next two years

For 2025-2026 MBC students will have a cost of \$550 per credit hour

For 2026-2027 the cost will increase to \$600 per credit hour

A graduate student in the MBC program taking 10 credits will pay approximately \$500 more per semester each year in both 2025-2026 and 2026-2027

College of Science Differential Tuition Increase

Amount requested: Increase from **\$60 to \$85** per student credit hour.

Plan: The increase allows the college to expand successful experiential learning, research, and peer mentoring programs, such as the Science Research Initiative (SRI). These programs have a demonstrated impact on student success, as measured by retention and GPA. To offset the increase, the college will increase scholarships and paid internship opportunities.
