WHEREAS, she brings more than two decades of leadership experience in the biopharmaceutical industry. She currently serves as the executive advisor at Recursion, having previously worked as its president and COO. She has also held senior leadership roles at Genentech, Roche, and Achaogen; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Marriott holds a Bachelor of Science in Chemical Engineering from Colorado State University; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Marriott has served the Board of Higher Education with distinction and brought valuable perspective, collaboration, and insight to the Utah System of Higher Education;
