



General Education Navigator/Academic Year 2023-24

SLCC's General Education (GE) program provides the subject-area knowledge and learning skills foundation for 2- and 4-year degrees. **Core** and **Institutional** courses make up the general education foundation. **Breadth/Distribution** courses give an opportunity to explore various subjects. General education courses are highly advisable for concurrent enrollment students; they are required for college graduation and transferable from one Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) institution to another. *Students completing all GE requirements – 5 concurrent enrollment classes each junior and senior year plus register separately for a 1 credit Wellness class – earn a*

SLCC Certificate of Completion in General Studies that is transferrable to all USHE institutions (you may have to complete unique institution graduation requirements only).

2. Speak with experts about GE choices. 1. Ask a HS counselor which GE classes are available at your school including all options (ex. AP). 2. Ask a SLCC academic advisor (<http://www.slcc.edu/concurrentenrollment/Students/advising-ce-advisors.html>) how your course choices fit different certificate and degree programs.
