

General Education Navigator/Academic Year 2023-24

UVU's General Education (GE) program provides the subject-area knowledge and learning skills foundation for 2- and 4-year degrees. **Core** and **Institution** courses make up the general education foundation. **Breadth** courses give an opportunity to explore various subjects. GE courses are highly advisable for concurrent enrollment students; they are required for college graduation and transferable from one Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) institution to another. *It is possible to complete UVU's GE requirements by taking 5-6 concurrent enrollment classes each, junior and senior year plus registering separately for a 2 credit Wellness class.*

2. **Speak with experts about GE choices.** 1. Ask a high school counselor which GE classes are available at your school, and about other ways to fulfill GE requirements (AP, for example). 2.
