TRANSCRIPTS

Education completed outside the United States needs to be evaluated by one of the following agencies:

- International Education Research Foundation (IERF)
- SpanTran

Please submit your academic documents to IERF or SpanTran at least 4-6 weeks before the Ensign application deadline.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

If English is not your first language, you may be required to prove English proficiency by providing results from one of these tests:

- TOEFL (iBT)
- · IELTS (Academic)
- Pearson's PTE
- Cambridge English Advanced Placement Test (CAE) or Proficiency Test (CPE)

Not sure if you need to provide proof of English proficiency? Once you complete the School Selection and Profile tabs of the application, the Status tab will indicate whether proof is required.

How to Apply

Ensign College uses a holistic review process, which means all parts of the application are considered. Here's what you need to apply:

- Equivalency of high school graduation/completion (no specific GPA minimum, just graduation) or completion of at least 24 semester credits of college work.
- · Ecclesiastical Endorsement
- Essay
- · One-time \$35 application fee

Our Story

Ensign College is named after Ensign Peak. On July 26, 1847, two days after arriving in the Salt Lake Valley, Brigham Young and several other men hiked to the top of a mountain he had seen in vision prior to beginning the trek west. From their vantage point, one thousand feet above the valley floor, the men "began to lay plans for the future city."

That spot was later named Ensign Peak because it was a symbol of the "spirit of international outreach and the ancient promise that here one could learn the ways of God." Throughout its history, Ensign College, now located in the shadow of Ensign Peak, has provided such an environment.
