Advanced Placement (AP) General Education Navigator

Academic Year 2025-26

High school students who take Advanced Placement (AP) classes take an end of course exam to earn college credit. At USHE institutions, an AP exam score of 3 or higher earns college credit. Most of this credit counts toward general education requirements which are necessary for college graduation and transferable between colleges. Earning different types of general education credit helps you progress toward college graduation.

First Step: Select one AP class from each general education category. Speak with the high school AP Coordinator or an academic advisor, preferably from the campus you intend to enroll in after high school, to confirm the type of general education credit you receive for different AP exams.
