





5-Year Overview of Degrees









Trend of New and Discontinued Degrees




New Degrees Per Discontinuance




Instructional Area* as Percentage of Total




12 Month Overview of Degrees

New Program Approval Process

Defined in Board Policy R401

- An institution submits a proposal for a new degree program to Commissioner's office.
- The proposal is reviewed by Commissioner's office staff and other USHE academic officers.
- The Peer Review Committee (PRC) discusses the proposal.
 - Faculty attend to answer questions and receive feedback/suggestions.
 - For regional universities proposing a graduate program, the Commissioner's Chief Economist also conducts a market analysis
- The Commissioner sends a report of PRC discussion, written comments, market analysis results (if applicable), and the Commissioner's office recommendations to the Board of Trustees (BOT) of the institution proposing the program.
- The BOT reviews and takes action on the program proposal.
- If the program proposal is approved by the BOT, the institution reports the approval
 date to the Commissioner's office, and the program is included on next Board of Higher
 Education meeting agenda as an information item.
