NEW CENTURY SCHOLARSHIP 2021 RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

Please read thoroughly, as there are changes to the scholarship requirements which affect students graduating high school in 2021.

INTRODUCTION

The New Century Scholarship was created in 1999 as a Governor's initiative to encourage students to accelerate their education by earning an associate degree in high school. In 2006 the option to complete a specified Math and Science Curriculum was added for those pursing a degree in a science, engineering, or math related field.

REQUIREMENTS

To qualify for the New Century Scholarship, applicants must meet the following non-academic and academic requirements:

NON-ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Be a United States citizen or a noncitizen eligible for federal student aid, as defined on studentaid.ed.gov.
- Fill out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Meet all deadlines

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Graduate from a Utah high school with a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA.
- Earn a 3.0 cumulative college grade point average.
- Home-schooled students and students who complete high school through an online school must take the ACT exam by June 15 of the year their peer group graduates from high school and earn a minimum composite score of 26.
- Enroll in and successfully complete 12 credit hours the fall semester after high school graduation at an eligible college or university, maintaining a 3.3 semester GPA or obtain an approved deferment.
- Complete one of the following academic options, by high school graduation:

Option 1: Associate Degree Track

Complete an associate degree through Dixie State University, Salt Lake Community College, Snow College, Southern Utah University, University of Utah (equivalence), Utah State University, Utah Valley University or Weber State University. If you plan to apply for the New Century Scholarship by completing the associate degree track, it is important that you work closely with the college/university from which you are earning the associate degree to plan out the needed course work.

You are required to file for graduation in order to have the associate degree posted to your official college transcript. You will be required to provide an official copy of your transcripts to show that you have earned the associate degree. Students who qualify for an associate degree equivalence from the University of Utah, must document it by completing the Associate Degree Equivalent Verification form.

Option 2: Math and Science Curriculum Track

Students who plan to major in engineering, math or science may want to choose to earn the New Century Scholarship by completing the Math and Science Curriculum Track. The required courses can be found on page 2. You must complete these requirements from a college within the Utah System of Higher Education (University of Utah, Utah

State University, Weber State University, Southern Utah University, Snow College, Dixie State University, Utah Valley University or Salt Lake Community College). Please note, not all courses are offered at all institutions.

MATH AND SCIENCE CURRICULUM TRACK

General Education Courses

- English 1010: Introduction to Writing or WRTG 1010
- English 2010: Intermediate Writing or WRTG 2010
- History 1700 American Civilizations <u>OR</u> Political Science 1100: American National Government <u>OR</u> score at least a 3 on the AP US History Exam
- General Education electives: 4 to 8 credit hours

Math Courses

- Math prerequisites: Math 1050: College Algebra and Math 1060: Trigonometry <u>OR</u> high school Pre Calculus <u>OR</u> score at least a 3 on the AP Calculus Exam
- Math 1210: Calculus 1

Science Courses

- Chemistry 1210: Principles of Chemistry 1
- Chemistry 1215: Principles of Chemistry 1 Lab

- Physics 2210: Physics for Scientists and Engineers 1
- Physics 2220: Physics for Scientists and Engineers 2

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Apply for the scholarship during your senior year. The application for the scholarship becomes available mid-November and is due February 1. The application itself will contain full details of the application process and what documentation to submit.

AWARD INFORMATION

The New Century Scholarship can be used at an eligible Utah College or University for up to 4 semesters. Scholarship funds can be used towards tuition and fees. The award amount for each student will vary based on other state aid that has been awarded to the student. The scholarship expires after 5 years from the date of high school graduation.

COLLEGE ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Enrollment at an eligible college is required Fall semester after high school graduation unless you receive an approved deferment from the New Century Scholarship Office. Students are required to enroll in and complete 12 credit hours earning a 3.3 GPA each semester for which they receive a disbursement.

TAKING A DEFERMENT OR LEAVE OF ABSENCE

If you do not enroll at an eligible institution the fall semester immediately following high school graduation, you must apply for and be granted an approved deferment through the New Century Scholarship office. Deferments are typically granted for major medical, military, or religious service reasons. However, deferments are not granted for working rather than enrolling in college course work, traveling, or to attend a non-eligible institution.

If you attend one or more semesters but then do not continuously enroll in fall and spring semesters due to medical, military or religious service reasons, you must apply for and be granted an approved leave of absence through the college you are attending.
